ALL of Mr. Ly's books can be counted upon to be excellent references, even after the antique price values are long outdated. With today's economy, it would be simply impossible to determine new pricing each year. Some people would use a simple inflation formula to change prices across the board, which is an extremely poor and inaccurate way to price antiques of any kind. To his credit, Mr Ly refuses to do this, instead offering ACCURATE price updating every few years or so. However, the value of his books are not really in the antique values, but in the marvelous original catalog illustrations that show the clocks the way they came from the factory. The collector can easily determine if their specimen has been modified or is missing parts, identify it by its original factory name, and determine a very close date for the manufacture of the clock in question.
