Essential Old English DictionaryBy Peter OakleyThis is a dictionary of Old English (English prior to the Norman Conquest, more or less) based on notes made by Bosworth (1789-1876) in his reading of Old English texts put together with material from his own reading by Toller (1844-1930). In the preface Toller pleads for indulgence for the defects of the work, on the grounds of the greatness of the task. Later works may improve on Bosworth and Toller, but to date no dictionary of comparable or larger scope has been published in its entirety, and so it is still the one to get. Perhaps there may be defects, but the dictionary is a pleasure to use: the words are copiously illustrated by real quotations, and in many cases the quotations are translated into Modern English.
