A ClassicBy TVR JrI used this book nearly 40 years ago when I was studying Japanese at the Defense Language Institute, and after I arrived in Japan.Although published shortly before I bought it in 1972, you'll find that it is still quite relevant. Japanese newspaper style is very conservative and has changed very little over the years.Instant recognition of just 500 combinations will allow you to get the jist of most newspaper articles. Magazines are a different problem. They use a much less formal style, and "katagana" words are sprinkled throughout with abandon.This book is what it says it is, "Newspaper Compounds". I haven't seen a frequency study for less formal written Japanese, but this book should be valuable for that as well.I guess it's out of print, but perhaps there is a similar, more recent, book out there.
