It also helped me enormously to calm down and write my dissertation proposal, which I just handed in. I'm very happy to have read it.Other reviewers have some valid critiques-- there is a (too?) confident, parental tone, and the salsa metaphor doesn't work all that well if you don't like or know about salsa dancing. On the other hand, she really is trying to make a case for how to do research that is going to be acceptable to "the canonical social scientist" (which, at least in my sociology department, is most faculty members) and still let the data speak for itself.In other words, if you're planning to do something qualitative, or if you want support for ideas that won't be immediately recognizable to established (quant-oriented) researchers as a legitimate project, DEFINITELY read this.Even if you're super into quantitative methods and want some help working out your question in relation to theory, you should read it.
